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ForwardHealth System Updates

New Bed Hold Billing Edit

- Providers may not bill bed hold for Medicare Part A stays
- Bed Hold claims will only be paid when a member had a Medicaid stay immediately preceding the temporary absence
- Regional Auditors will continue to manually verify that the 94% occupancy test has been met via the Annual Cost Report



ForwardHealth System Updates

Third Party Liability Edit

- Medicaid is the "Payer of Last Resort"
- Claims submitted via revenue code 192 must include information related to attempts to bill other insurance
- Detailed information will be provided at the August Public Meeting
- Effective date of new edit will be October 1, 2015



ForwardHealth System Updates

BadgerCare "Childless Adults"

- BadgerCare members in a Nursing Home >30 days are disenrolled from the Health Maintenance Organization (HMO)
- Providers should submit claims as fee for service
- "Childless Adults" eligible under Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) rules do not pay patient liability

Status of Biennial Budget Bill

- The Biennial Budget Bill currently is still under review by the Joint Committee on Finance (JFC)
- The JFC review and executive action on the Medicaid budget has been completed but Transportation issues have caused delays in completing the budget.
- Typically, there are few changes to the budget after JFC review, but Assembly and Senate review of the Biennial Budget could modify the Budget provisions for Medicaid and other areas.
- Also, after Assembly/Senate review, there can be partial vetoes by the Governor.

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Nursing Home Reimbursement Rate

- Although the Governor's recommendation did not include any intensity adjustment or rate increase, JFC did add a 1% intensity adjustment for non-DD care levels in FY17.
- Funding of \$7,614,400 AF (\$3,186,300 GPR) is added for FY17.
- Of this amount, \$6,295,400 AF is for fee-for-service patient days while the remainder is for Family Care / Pace/Partnership (\$1,070,200 AF) and Hospice (\$251,800 AF) patient days.
- This funding is only for non-DD care levels. There is no intensity or rate increase for DD care levels.



Labor Region Study

- JFC added a provision to require the Department to study the labor region methodology.
- In addition, the Department is required to propose changes to this methodology no later than July 1, 2016.
- The proposed methodology must result in adjustments to direct care costs that reflect labor costs in each county.



Bed Assessment Exemption

- JFC added a provision to exempt from the licensed bed assessment:
- County government-owned institutions for mental disease (IMDs) and
- State-only licensed facilities.
- These exemptions are conditional upon the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) finding them to be consistent with federal law and rules on provider taxes.



Nursing Bed Transfers

- JFC added a provision that requires the Department to develop a policy that specifies procedures for applying for, and receiving approval of, the transfer of available, licensed nursing home beds among counties.
- The Department is required to report to JFC no later than July 1, 2016.



County/Municipal Supplements

- The Biennial Budget retains the same funding level of \$39.1 million AF for the supplement.
- The Budget also retains the statutory requirement that any federal revenue based on county/municipal-owned nursing home deficits in excess of biennial budgeted levels would be paid to county/municipal-owned homes.
- The Biennial Budget estimates that the federal revenue based on county/municipal home deficits will be \$35,134,200 both in FY 16 and FY 17.



Family Care Changes

- The Biennial Budget contains significant changes to the Family Care Program that are targeted to begin January 1, 2017.
- Due to the scope of the changes and the need for CMS approval, the implementation date could be later than January 1, 2017.
- Changes that are required to be part of the waiver request to CMS include:
 - Statewide expansion of Family Care
 - Require acute care to be included in the Family Care benefit, including Medicare services to the extent allowed by CMS
 - Increase the size of regions served by MCOs, but require at least five regions
 - Incorporate IRIS into Family Care

Potential Rate Change

Ventilator Rate Review – s.4.691

- Second year of data collection underway.
- Workgroup to reconvene later this summer.



Potential Rate Change

Effective date for RUGS score – s. 2.410

- Picture quarter approach very accurate overall.
- Lags occur between admit date and MDS assessment.
 Most common cause of "NA" records for Title 19 residents
- Addressing the lag will have a small impact on funding
 - Analysis by CHSRA suggests a potential impact of ca. \$0.05/day for facilities above the Direct Care target



Clarifications & Edits

Patient day definition – s. 1.315

- Partial day billing is not allowed in ForwardHealth.
- *Methods* allow reporting of partial days.
- Overstating patient days on Schedule 6 *lowers rate*.
- Revise *Methods* to align with billing rules.



Clarifications & Edits

No bed hold billing for Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) units – s. 1.510

- Not allowed per DHS internal policy.
- Language not included in *Methods*.
- TBI providers have not billed bed hold.



Clarifications & Edits

Obsolete reference to Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) guidance – s. 3.523

- Update needed to reflect current reference.
- Obsolete reference to FASB Statement No. 13 (GAAP).
- Current reference: ASC 840-30.



Clarifications & Edits Confusing reference to GAAP – s. 3.525 (3)

- Depreciation is calculated according to straight line.
- Other approaches may be allowable under GAAP, but not under the *Methods*.



Clarifications & Edits

Clarifying lease maximum determination – s. 3.523 (3)

- Current *Methods* language on lease maximum for new or replacement facilities is vague.
- Revision documents current audit practice.



Clarifications & Edits

Routine Methods language edits

- Updates will be made to effective dates and rate periods.
- Formatting fixes, spelling errors and similar typographical errata will be corrected as identified.




