Scope of Nursing Home Clinical Performance System

- Nursing Home Service Providers
 - ICF/ID's (exclude – CMP funding for NH's only)
 - License (ICF's, TBI units, IMD's, Behavioral units)
 - Certification (Medicaid, Medicare)
 - Hospital Swing Beds
- Target Population Served
 - Payer (Medicaid, Medicare, Other)
 - Post-Acute vs. Medicare vs. Short-Stay
 - Special Services (TBI, Ventilator, Hospice)

Scope of Nursing Home Clinical Performance System

- Services Subject to Clinical Performance Measurement
 - Clinical vs. Quality-of-Life measures
 - Selection Criteria
- Measurement Type
 - Resident-level process measures (vaccinations, restraints, catheters, antipsychotic drugs, CAA follow-up)
 - Resident-level outcome measures (falls, pressure ulcers, decline in functional status, urinary tract infections, depression, weight loss, pain, and incontinence)
 - Facility-level process measures (staffing levels, training efforts, QI certification)
 - Facility-level outcome measures (staff turnover, deficiency citations, profitability)

Scope of Nursing Home Clinical Performance System

- Reporting Period
 - Dictated by Data Sources
 - Frequency
 - Reporting Lag
- Other

Data Sources

- MDS assessment and tracking records
- WI LTC functional screen
- NH service claims/encounters
- Other care provider claims/encounters
- Drug claims
- Survey and complaint deficiencies
- Staffing (payroll)
- Cost reports
- Vital statistics
- NH buildings (age and layout)
- Other

Measurement Issues

- Source data availability
 - Should measures be limited to existing sources?
 - Should self-reported NH data be considered?
- Source data reliability
 - What level of auditing should be applied to source data?
- Reporting frequency and lag
 - Should preliminary data be used?
- Risk adjustment
 - Which factor effects are to be removed?
 - Complexity of adjustment mechanism?

Measurement Issues

- Credibility (based on volume of data)
 - Masking vs. confidence intervals vs. shrinkage estimators
 - Co-mingling small and large facility values in percentiles
- Aggregation of measures
 - Is any measure aggregation needed?
- Measure standards
 - Absolute vs. relative standards
- Reporting measure trends
- Feedback and refinement of reporting system
- Other

Possible Additional Measures

- Actual-to-Expected Resident Outcomes
 - Mortality, deterioration in functional, cognitive, behavioral status
 - Medical status (measured by, say, chronic conditions)
 - RUG classification
 - Discharge to community
- Care Area Assessment Process Measures
 - MDS-based denominators
 - Self-Reported numerators
- Drug Quality Indicators
- Other
